## This funding will be used to

By end of Semester 2, 2016:

- Increase by 20 %, the number of students in **Year 1** reading at greater than PM Benchmark Level 16.
- Increase by 20 %, the number of students in **Year 2** reading at greater than PM Benchmark Level 22.
- Increase by 20 %, the number of students in **Year 6** reading at greater than Probe Level 14.
- Increase the percentage of students at, or above the NAPLAN National Minimum Standard from 90% in 2014 Year 3, to 96 % in 2016 Year 5 reading.

## Our initiatives include

- Developing a shared understanding of 'data literacy' and supporting teachers and leadership teams to effectively use data to inform targeted teaching
  - Interrogating literacy/numeracy data to determine how teachers use this data to improve student outcomes.
  - Reviewing data regularly using local testing and other measures as identified in the Redbank Data Plan.
  - Providing ongoing support to classroom teachers to implement and develop data-driven strategies to improve student outcomes.
- Targeting identified groups of students by providing them with access to intense, research-based intervention and appropriate resources.
  - Revisiting and refining the school pedagogical framework and embedding it as the shared language of teaching and learning
- Maintaining an uninterrupted Literacy Block across the school to ensure consistency of pedagogical practices as outlined in the Pedagogical Framework.

Employing teacher aides to continue supporting students below or predicted to be below NMS in reading through implementing LLI as well as supporting Literacy Blocks.	\$135 000
Engaging a Data Coach to enhance teacher data literacy.	\$46 750
Providing relevant resources to support the initiatives outlined in the agreement.	\$19 230
